

April 13, 2023: Addis Abeba: The Ethiopian Civil Society Organizations Council (ECSOC) has continuously been the voice of the civil society sector regarding emerging concerns in Ethiopia. The Council has repeatedly been reminding all parties to conflicts and disputes to resolve their differences through dialogue.

The Council has come to understand that civilians have been injured and lost their lives in the conflict that occurred in some localities of the Amhara region. The council has also learned that two workers of the Catholic Relief Service were among those who were killed in the recent incident. While this being the case, reliable sources indicated that two Ethiopian Red Cross Society workers were also injured while on duty.



Repeated attacks targeting humanitarian aid workers and causing loss of life is not only a grave concern for the Council but also a serious threat to derail the humanitarian efforts being underway to reach those in need.

In this regard, the Ethiopian Civil Society Organizations Council calls for a restraint on current conflicts and demand for the protection of humanitarian workers deployed in conflict prone areas.

ECSOC reaffirms its commitment in continuing its efforts for lasting peace in our country and pledges to continue to advocate for the peaceful resolution of all types of conflicts and disagreements.
